1. A PROFILE OF SILAPATHAR COLLEGE

The Silapathar College established in 1979 is located in the heart of a rapidly growing small township-Silapathar which is surrounded by villages of tribal and backward communities in the Dhemaji District of Assam.

The institution is permanently affiliated to the Dibrugarh University. It was brought under deficit system of grant-in-aid in 1992 and was subsequently provincialised in 2005 by the Government of Assam. The college registered under 2(f) and 12(b) of UGC Act 1956 was first accredited by NAAC in 2005 with 'B' Grade and was subsequently re-accredited (cycle 2) in 2015 obtaining Grade B with CGPA of 2.62 .

The college provides education for Higher Secondary and Under Graduate levels in Arts Faculty. From the session 2016-17, the college is also introducing Higher Secondary course in Science Stream. Self financing course in Computer Applications, UGC sponsored Career Oriented Programme like Travel and Tourism Management, Certificate Courses under different UGC sponsored study centres like Women Studies Centre, Indira Gandhi Study Centre & Dr. Ambedkar Study Centre and UG and PG distance education programmes under Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) & Directorate of Distance Education, Dibrugarh University (DDEDU) are offered in the college.

2. VISION:

Spreading the walls of quality higher education by dissolving barriers and creating an apt environment for holistic progression of the students, academically and beyond with focus on the rich multi-cultural milieu of the land.

3. MISSION:

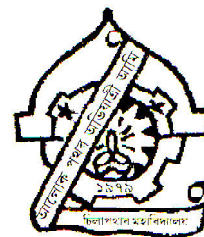
Imparting higher education to the desiring and deserving, the unprivileged and deprived and encouraging them to confidently remain rooted in the global knowledge society for generating competent, compassionate and charitable human resource motivated by sublime humane values.

4. THE COLLEGE EMBLEM:

The uneven wheel that dominates the college emblem with black spot in it stands for unequal progress and dynamism of civilization. The burning lamp (pradip) amidst darkness (black spot) within the wheel symbolizes light of knowledge – knowledge is power — to be achieved by endeavour. The conical cap in the shape of the fore of a pipal leave on the wheel signifies the height or peak of modern civilization that has made way beyond stars.

The pipal tree also symbolizes Indian heritage of meditation for achieving knowledge. The band on which the sentence “আলোক পথৰ অভিযাত্রী আমি” is inscribed in Assamese meaning ‘we are the seekers of light (knowledge) in thorny paths’ is obliquely folded at the bottom as a base on which the name of the institution, চিলাপথাৰ মহাবিদ্যালয় (Silapathar College) is inscribed.

The diagonal part of the band that embraces both the wheel and the cap together indicates the motto of the college which aims at fostering excellence of human potential by cultivating the ideals of perseverance.





5. PROGRAMMES OF STUDY:

Higher Secondary (HS) & Under Graduate (UG-BA) level courses under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) and the Dibrugarh University (DU) are respectively offered in regular mode in Arts stream. The college is also introducing 1st Year Higher Secondary course in Science Stream from the current session 2016-17.

7. COMBINATION OF SUBJECTS:

English and MIL are compulsory for both H.S. and UG programmes, Alternative English may be offered in lieu of MIL and any four subjects may be chosen for combinations in case of Higher Secondary class while any two subjects for UG class. Students offering Major may opt for any two subjects other than the Major subject.

Note: *Change in course combination once selected in the 1st Semester is not allowed. There is no restriction in subject combination.*

8. THE COURSE STRUCTURE AND SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS:

As a part of the new initiatives of the UGC in XI Plan for academic reforms, Dibrugarh University has introduced Semester System at the Under-Graduate (UG) level from 2011-2012 and is now in force.

The thoroughly revised, restructured and updated course structure is as follows:

The duration of the programmes for Degree Courses is of three years. The Three Year Degree Course comprises 6 (six) semesters of which the 1st, 3rd and 5th semesters will be called **Odd Semesters** and the 2nd, 4th and 6th semester will be known as **Even Semesters**. The time-span of the Odd Semesters shall be from 15th June to 30th November, while that of the Even Semester from 1st January to 31st May. There shall be two **In-Semester Examinations** (First Sessional and Second Sessional Examinations) in the course of each Semester before the commencement of the **End Semester Examination**. The marks obtained by students in these examinations shall be notified department-wise in the Departmental Notice Board in the later part of September and in the month of October respectively.

The 1st Semester students will have to attend a Counselling Session which will be organized by the College Authority on 1st day of commencement of classes. There shall also be a Students' Counselling Session and Mid Semester Feedback Assessment during the later part of August. The classes of the Odd Semesters (1st Semester, 3rd Semester and 5rd Semester) shall be completed by the end of November, every year and the ones of the Even Semesters (2nd Semester, 4th Semester and 6th Semester) by the end of May, every year.

Each paper will be of 100 marks of which 20 marks will be for **Internal Assessment** and 80% marks for **End Semester Examination**. Students will have to participate in the process of Internal Assessment compulsorily, failing which they will not be allowed to appear in the **End-Semester Examination**. A student cannot repeat **In-Semester Examinations** (Sessional Examinations). A student must obtain at least 40% marks in the End-Semester examinations or at least 40% marks in the course in aggregate in the In-Semester and End-Semester examinations.

There shall be one End Semester Examination of three hour duration carrying 80% marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. . The types of the courses and marks allotted to them in both General and Major Programmes may shown as follows:

NB: In the 5th and 6th Semesters of the General Programmes, there shall be no Compulsory Course. Instead there shall be two Skilled-Based Courses in each of the 5th and 6th Semester.



Dibrugarh University has approved 7 (seven) courses as Skill Based Course from which students will have to opt one course as skill based course.

Courses are (for Arts)

1. Creative Writing
2. Teaching in Elementary Level
3. Entrepreneurship Development
4. Retail Management
5. Desktop Publishing
6. Travel and Tourism Management
7. Photoshop and Web Design.

9. ATTENDANCE:

a) HS COURSE:

Students attending 75% or more classes shall be allowed to appear in the examination as **Regular Candidates**. Students attending 60% or more classes but less than 75% shall be allowed to appear at the examination as **Non-Collegiate Candidates** on payment of a Non-Collegiate Fee fixed by the AHSEC. A student attending less than 60% of classes shall be declared as Dis-collegiate and will be debarred from appearing in the Annual/Final Examination. Penalty shall be charged on the students who have failed to appear in the internal periodical examinations. The holding of examination and declaration of the result of the Annual Examination will be regulated by the norms of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council.

b) UNDER GRADUATE COURSE:

A student should have at least 80% attendance and must obtain at least 40% marks in the In-Semester examinations to sit for the End-Semester Examination.

To be a regular candidate in the End Semester Examinations, a student must obtain 80% to 100% marks in attendance and participate in all activities performed in the process of Internal Assessment.



10. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

Internal Assessment is a method of assessing a student's punctuality, regularity and aptitude in learning process. In this method, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, group discussion etc. are employed. The procedure for Internal Assessment is prescribed below:

The 20% marks allotted for Internal Assessment in each course shall be based on :

- (i) Sessional Examination-I
- (ii) Sessional Examination-II and
- (iii) Seminar/Group/Discussion/Home Assignment etc.

Distribution of marks of Internal Assessment will be as follows :

- i) Sessional-I (written) will carry a total of 5 Marks (25%)
- ii) Sessional-II (written) will carry a total of 5 Marks (25%)
- iii) Seminar/Group Discussion/Home Assignment will carry a total of 5 Marks (25%).
- iv) Attendance 5 Marks (25%)

As per DU Guideline No. DU/DR-A/8-1/12/1552 dated 18/01/2013 Marks of Internal Assessment (20%) for attendance shall be awarded as below:

There shall be **no provision for “repeat”/ “betterment”** in the sessional examinations. If a student misses any sessional examination for unavoidable reasons, the student may be allowed to appear in a separate examination at the discretion of the concerned department but with a valid reason. The marks of internal assessment secured by a candidate shall be carried over to his/her next legitimate chances. The students will be informed in advance about the nature of assessment.

Students shall compulsorily participate in tasks of Internal Assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to sit for the End-Semester Examination.

**11. EXPLANATORY NOTE:****a) Semester:**

The word “semester” is used to mean a half-yearly programme or a half-yearly term of studies in a system of continuous evaluation.

b) In-semester:

The word “in-semester” is used to refer to the continuous studies and evaluations through the two Sessional Examinations (Sessional I & II) within the half-yearly programme.

c) End –semester:

The word “end-semester” is used to refer to the terminal processes of examinations and evaluations at the end of but within the half-yearly programme.

d) Semester Classifications:

The 1st, 3rd & 5th Semesters will be called *Odd Semesters* (Period: June 1– November 30), and the 2nd, 4th & 6th Semesters will be called *Even Semesters* (Period: December 1– May 30).

e) Skill-Based Courses:

A skill based course shall be mandatory for all students pursuing General B.A. Programme. The college shall offer the Skill-based Courses as per its own infrastructure and human resource feasibility.

Considering the importance of the diverse needs of the locality, rapidly changing socio-economic scenario and the emerging trends of employment in the global market the institution has introduced a series of programmes under the Directorate of Distance Education, Dibrugarh University and Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University. Both Under Graduate and Post-Graduate Programmes operated under Semester System. Apart from these Degree Programmes a number of Job Oriented Courses have also been introduced. These programmes are as follows :

**13. SELF-FINANCING COMPUTER PROGRAMME :**

The college has been successfully running a self financing Diploma in Computer Application (DCA) course. The fee structure of the course is made very simple and easily affordable.

14. OTHER PROGRAMMES

In addition to the programmes detailed above, the college is running some study centres funded by University Grants Commission (UGC) for quality enhancement and dissemination of information and knowledge. The programmes are:

15. CENTRE FOR WOMEN'S STUDIES:

The Centre for Women's Studies was established in 2009. The Centre is devoting itself to organizing workshops, seminars, awareness campaigns etc. since its inception. Considering the needs of this area, the Centre is running a *3 months Certificate Course in Women's Studies* of three months' duration during this academic session (2012-13) and launch documentation and research projects. The course is designed to meet up the need of understanding women's issues in the context of higher education.

16. CENTRE FOR AMBEDKAR STUDY:

In the context of eradication of social discrimination in terms of caste and creed, Ambedkar's struggle for nation building is considered important in and relevant to present social scenario of identity crisis of the deprived and the excluded. With a view to disseminating the philosophy of Ambedkar who was the architect of the Constitution of Indian Republic among the social groups who have developed a sense of alienation, the college established the Centre for Ambedkar Study which provides 3 months certificate course in the discipline.

17. INDIRA GANDHI STUDY CENTRE:

The college also established centres for study on Indira Gandhi. This study centre conducts research, organizes seminars, render extension services and organize awareness campaigns about this great personality and her contribution to the nation. The centre also provides 3 months certificate course in Indira Gandhi Study.

18. CAREER ORIENTED PROGRAMMES: TRAVEL AND TOURISM:

Now-a-day, Tourism is a major industry around the world. Considering the importance of tourism as job oriented industry, the college introduced a UGC financed "Career Oriented Programme" (COP) of 'Travel and Tourism' during the last academic session 2013-14. A certificate course of



one year duration is offered to BA Semester students of this college and launch documentation and extension works. This course is designed to meet up the understanding about 'Travel and Tourism' in the context of local level as well as global level. Mr. Lalit Chandra Doley is the Coordinator of the course.

19. ENTRY INTO SERVICES:

The college has started Entry into service, a career oriented programme funded by UGC for the 5th Semester students to make them prepared for various competitive services.

***NB :** *Students intending to get into any one of the areas of studies provided in the Centres may contact the Co-ordinator of the corresponding Centre.*

20. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

Prescribed Application Forms along with the Prospectus of the college can be had from the college office during working hours. The duly filled-in forms should be submitted to the college office enclosing all required supporting documents on or before the date as fixed and notified by the Admission Committee. Incomplete forms are summarily rejected. Select list for admission is prepared by the Admission Committee and shall be displayed on the notice board on the basis of marks obtained by the candidates in the last examination. The sort-listed candidates must take admission within the period specified by the committee.

Students desirous of offering Major Programme should contact the Head of the concerned Department in addition to making mention of their desires in the Admission Forms and their choosing of Major Programme must be finalized within one week from the date of commencement of the classes.

As per Dibrugarh University Rules, there shall be no provision for admission-on-transfer from other University and inter-college transfer.

At the time of admission, reservation policy will be followed as per Govt. rules.

NB:

- *** *Students who have obtained less than 40% marks should not apply for admission. However, relaxation by 5 marks is provided for SC/ST students.*
- *** *The college authority shall have the right to reject admission to any one without assigning any reason thereof.*

**21. COLLEGE UNIFORM:**

Wearing of uniform in the college campus by students is mandatory. Any student found without uniform is not allowed to attend classes or transact any matter in the college office. The uniform of the college is described below :

- i) For Boys: Black trouser (long pant) and light blue shirt.
- ii) For Girls: Light blue churidar kurta with white dupatta.
- iii) For both Boys and Girls : Navy blue sweater.

22. GENERAL RULES:

- i) Every student of the college must strictly maintain discipline either individually or in a body in the college campus. Any student found to have a conduct detrimental to academic environment of the college shall immediately be expelled from the college.
- ii) Every student of the college is a member of the Silapathar College Students' Union and, therefore, he/she will have to participate in any event organized by the union under the control and guidance of the principal and the teaching staff. The Union will have to function within the framework of the rules and regulations prescribed by the college authority from time to time.
- iii) All notices/posters/banners desired to be circulated on the notice board or elsewhere within the college campus shall require prior permission of the principal.
- iv) The signature of the Principal on the Identity Card must be obtained within 15 days from the date of admission. The Identity Card must be kept in possession by all students in the college campus all the time.
- v) All the office bearers of the Students' Union must submit their audited accounts and allied documents/materials to the Principal at the end of academic session immediately before filling up the forms for examination.
- vi) All students including the office bearers of the Union must obtain Library Clearance Certificate from the authority concerned before filling up forms for examination.
- vii) Damage or destruction of college properties and involvement in causing disruption of normal functioning of classes is treated as heinous offence which will lead to expulsion from the college along with fine.
- viii) Indecent behaviour by students towards teachers and employees of the college will be seriously dealt with severe punishment.



- ix) Use of drugs, cigar and narcotic substances is strictly prohibited.
- x) Tearing of library books, journals etc. resorts to payment of compensation.
- xi) Wearing of uniform in indecent way, bearing of informal haircut etc. are strictly prohibited.
- xii) No use of mobile phone is allowed in the college campus. Any student found to have violated this rule will attract severe punishment with seizure of the phone.

Reservation of seats is provided for:

- a) Physically Challenged students and

 - (iii) Literature

25. EVALUATION METHODS:

Students' learning experience is evaluated from time to time in a continuous process of evaluation system through Unit Tests, Periodical Examinations in the Higher Secondary Classes and through In-Semester (Sessional) Examinations, Seminars/Group Discussion/Assignment within the college in the BA Semester classes. In addition to these systems of evaluation, final examinations are conducted by the AHSEC Council for Higher Secondary classes and End-Semester Examinations by the Dibrugarh University for Degree Programmes.

The Internal Monitoring Committee under IQAC follows strict adherence to the principles of evaluation system by all concerned..

26. STUDENT ADALAT (STUDENTS' SUPPORT SYSTEM):

Silapathar College aims to ensure that every student has equal access to competent and qualitative teaching which leads to vibrant academic, social and personal growth. To this end, the college has



adopted a student charter wherein the students and the teachers meet on the 1st Saturday of every month to encourage the students in continuous and comprehensive learning and progression.

27. STUDENTS' ORGANISATION:

Silapathar College Students' Union (SCSU) is the only bonafide students' organization in the college. No other students' body is allowed in the college campus. The objective of having this union body is to train the students' tolerance and democratic values by getting them involved in it. The office bearers of the union are elected annually by the students from among themselves.

28: COLLEGE MAGAZINE:

The Silapathar College Students' Union has a mouthpiece designated as "SILAPATHAR COLLEGE MAGAZINE" which is annually published by them. The magazine serves as the vehicle of reflecting intellectual world of the college.

c) GIRLS' HOSTEL :

All boarders must abide by the following rules and regulations:

- (vi) Damage of hostel property caused by any boarder is dealt with severe punishment along with charging of compensation. Depending upon the nature and reason of damage, she may be expelled from the hostel as well as from the college.

Virtual Classroom lets institutions of higher education reach students anywhere, any time, by blending fully interactive and recordable audio, video, and web conferencing capabilities. With these proven, powerful tools, educational institutions can extend the walls of their classrooms in both space and time, and bring the rest of the world to their campuses.

38. MINI MUSEUM:

To showcase the rich traditional and cultural heritage of the tribal and indigenous peoples of North East India, Silapathar College has established a mini museum under the UGC sponsored Tribal Study Centre since 2007.

39. VERMI COMPOST:

The college has also started to recycle bio-waste by forming Vermi Compost Units in its campus. Vermi composting is the process of using earthworms to turn organic wastes into very high-quality compost. The worm casts contain five times more nitrogen, seven times more phosphorus and eleven times more potassium than ordinary soil which is essential for healthy plant growth.

40. HEALTH CARE CENTRE:

Health Care Centre has been established to promote physical and mental well being of the students. A part time physician and a nurse have been appointed for health check up. The college has a separate room with essential infrastructure and first aid medicines. We intend to provide health care information and become an important source of service provider for faculty, staff and students of the college.

v) ANTI RAGGING COMMITTEE:

Ragging is an illegal and punishable in strictest and most exemplary terms as per the ruling of Supreme Court of India. Complying with the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Silapathar College has formed the Anti Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad for taking the menace of ragging and observing the implementation of provisions of the verdict with immediate effect. Each student must show the respect and courtesy to the teachers, administrator, employees and visitors. They must not infringe upon the rights of fellow students.

vi) ANTI RAGGING SQUAD:

Hon'ble Supreme Court in SPL No. 24295 of 2006 dt. 16/05/2007 and in Civil Appeal No. 887 of 2009 dt. 08/05/2009 issued direction to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student, or indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student or asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physic or psyche of such fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student, in all higher education institutions in the country.

In pursuance of the above, the college has formed an anti-ragging squad so as to effectively implement the all preventive measures. The squad is empowered to make surprise visits at any corner of the college campus, even in the hostels as and when felt necessary and keep vigilance over there.



vii) HOSTEL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:

A Hostel Management Committee is constituted to look into the matters of the Women's Hostel of the college. There will be a separate bye-law which shall govern the powers and functions of the Hostel Management Committee.
